

CONFLICT MINERIALS POLICY

Safety Excellence, Casting Excellence, Machining Excellence

Grainger & Worrall Ltd is committed to ensuring that all of our products comply with the “**conflict minerals**” provision, commonly known as Section 1502 of the **Dodd Frank Act**.

This act requires all companies to check their supply chains for Tin, Tungsten, Tantalum and Gold (3TG) known as “conflict minerals” to ensure they do not originate from the Congo (DRC) or neighboring countries.

To ensure we comply with the above regulations we carry out the following actions:

1. Contact all our aluminium suppliers and request conflicting minerals information from them.
2. 100% of our suppliers have responded with the required information, we have evidence of these supplier responses if required.
3. We purchase aluminium from 3rd party aluminium producers.
4. All our aluminium suppliers confirmed that: No 3TG is intentionally added or used in the product(s) or in the production process.
5. Grainger and Worrall do not purchase or intentionally add any 3TG in any of our products or in the production processes.
